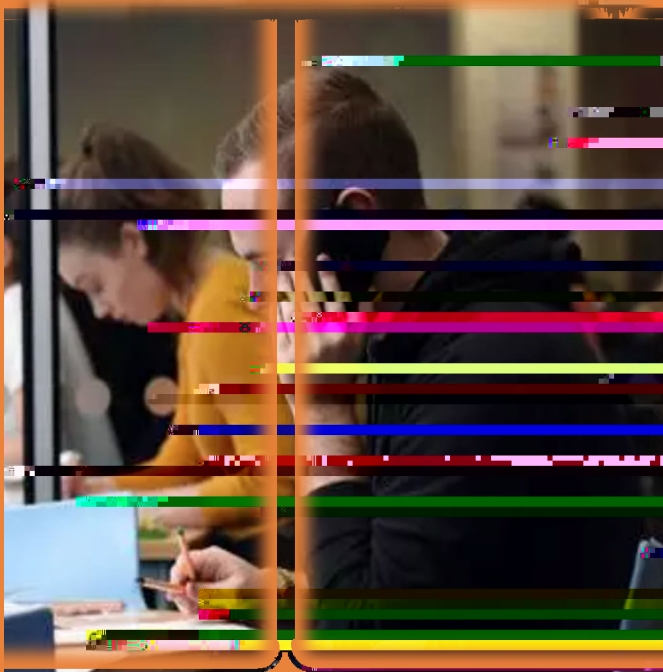
Round 2: Week 13

Academic Word: **adequate (adj) / æd. .kw t/**

Meaning: to have enough of something or to be of a high enough quality

Collocations: 'less than adequate' / 'totally adequate' / 'an adequate amount of'

Examples: The hospital does not have an adequate number of beds.



General English Expression:
'better late than never'

Meaning: Even if an action is being done late or a person is arriving late, it is better that it is happening at the later time than not at all.

Example: "It took them a long time to understand that they had made a mistake, but better late than never."

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
