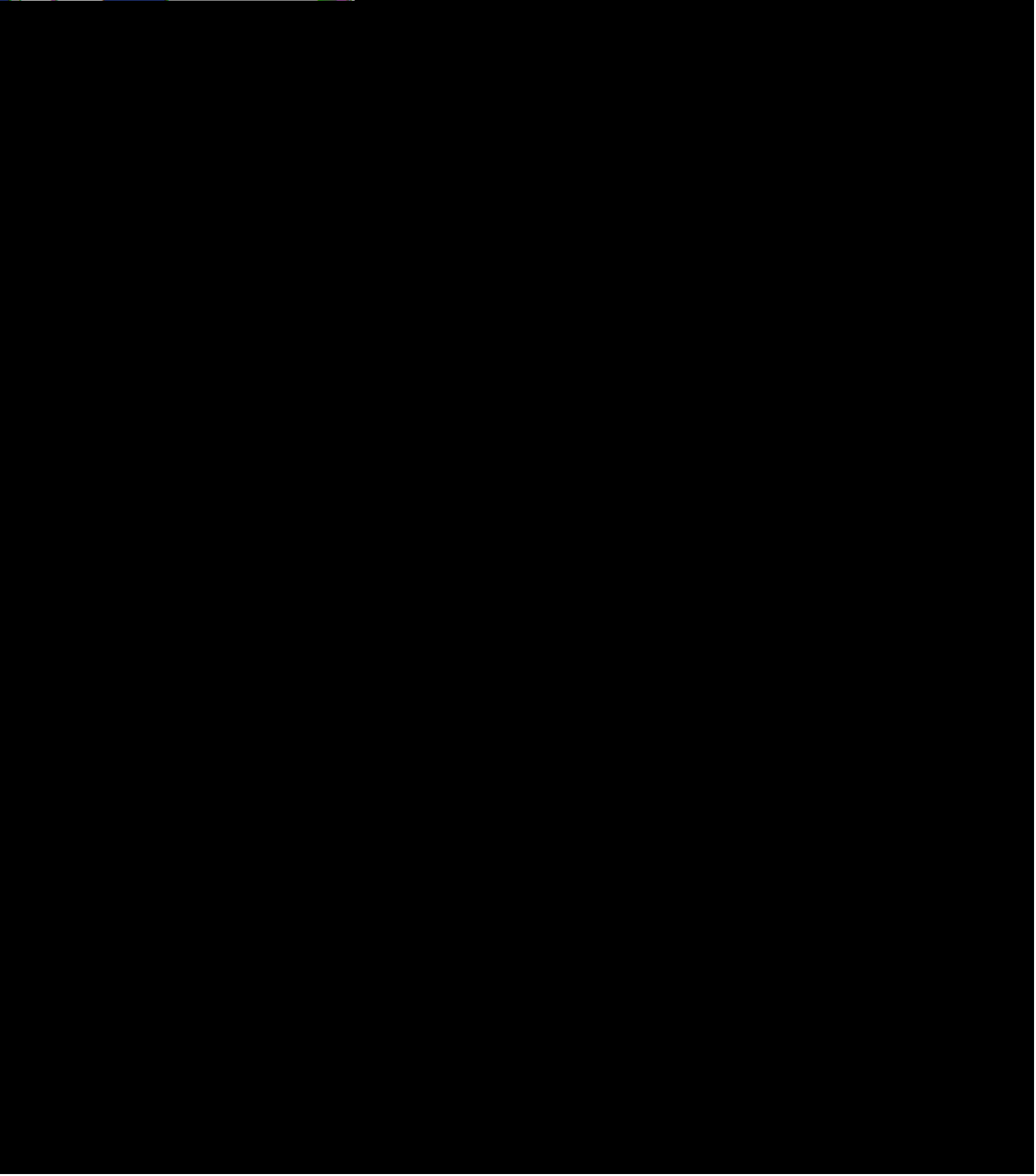


This international one-day symposium examines the role the university campus plays in higher education and the local community.
